


First Day Student Checklist

- ☐ The younger the grade, the wider the line spacing
- \square Plain newsprint for math



Textbooks

- \square Textbooks numbered for inventory purposes
- ☐ Textbooks assigned to individual students
- ☐ Textbooks for all curricular areas
- \square Reading textbook, including consumable books
- ☐ Math textbook, including consumable books
- ☐ Science textbook, including consumable books
- ☐ Social Science textbook, including consumable books

Journals

- ☐ One per student per subject area
- ☐ Provided by school or created by the student
- ☐ Journal writing to be modeled to whole class

Homework Folders

- ☐ Folders for tracking homework and home communications from the school
- ☐ One side labeled "Homework," the other "Paperwork"
- ☐ Decorated by the student
- Optional cover with grade-appropriate learning tools (alphabet, multiplication table, etc.)
